As per section 20 (1) of the *Wildlife Act* is is a requirement for every permit application for possession of live wildlife (falconry exempt), transport of live wildlife, export of live wildlife, release of live wildlife from captivity and the import of live wildlife that applicants demonstrate the ability to adequately care for all live wildlife included in the application.

- 1. What are the dimensions and material of the transport carrier? What bedding materials are provided?
- 2. What are the dimensions and material of the housing while in British Columbia? What bedding materials are provided?
- 3. Will the animal be in its' own transport and housing enclosure? If not, what animals will be contained with it?
- 4. How will transport and housing containment be secured or locked and who will have access?
- 5. How is temperature monitored and regulated during transport and containment?

- 6. How often is food and fresh water provided?
- 7. What food is provided?
- 8. What signs will be monitored for indication of stress and/or illness? What will be done if these signs are detected?
